This is not a stand-alone document. To understand and use these tables, refer to the main report, ESOPs as Retirement Benefits.

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This supplemental report contains three tables: \$1, \$2 and \$3.

Table S1 shows company contributions to the ESOP and to the first DC plan (for non-ESOP companies). It is an expanded version of table 5 part D in the main report.

Table S2 shows the change in assets in the ESOP and in the first DC plan (for non-ESOP companies). It is an expanded version of table 9 part B in the main report.

Table S3 shows accumulated assets per participant in the ESOP and in the first DC plan (for non-ESOP companies). It is an expanded version of table 6 part B in the main report.

Each of these tables include breakdowns for different types of companies. For each of the three tables, part A has the differences by sizes of the work force, part B breaks companies down by their type of business as represented by the two-digit NAICS code, and part C shows differences among companies by the ages of their plans.
